PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

| Citation | 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food Security (Avocado Crop Management) Regulations, 2026. |
| Interpretation | 2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires- |
| Cap. 249 | “Act” means the Food Security Act; |
| | “chilling injury” means physiological damage to avocados caused by rapid changes in ambient temperature; |
| | “cold chain” means a system of maintaining optimal temperature conditions throughout the storage and transportation process; |
| | “dry matter content” means the percentage of an avocado fruit that is not water and which is an indicator of maturity; |
| | “export” means the transportation of avocado from Tanzania to another country for commercial purposes; |
| | “extension officer” means an agricultural expert who provides professional advisory services on farming practices and other extension matters to farmers and stakeholders; |
| | “farmer” means a person who engages in the commercial cultivation of avocado; |
| | “foreign purchaser” means a buyer who is not a Tanzanian citizen; |

- “grading” means the process of grading avocados according to color, shape, defects, dry matter, oil content, peduncle, size, bruises or weight;
- “intercropping” means the cultivation of two or more crops simultaneously on the same farm in a manner that is compatible and utilizes growth inputs such as fertilizers, water, and light without adversely affecting each other;
- “maturity indicator” means a criterion specified under these Regulations used to determine the optimal stage of ripeness for harvesting avocados;
- Cap.130 “packaging material” means any material that has standards specified under the Standards Act used to store, protect, preserve, transport or display avocados;
- “pack house” means a facility where avocado is cleaned, sorted, graded, packed, and prepared for market;
- “seedling” means avocado that has been propagated and prepared for planting on farms;
- Cap.308 “seedling producer” means any person engaged in the propagation of avocado seedlings that have been registered and recognized in accordance with the Seeds Act;
- “service provider” means a farmer or any person or entity duly recognized and authorized by the Authority to provide services within the avocado value chain; and
- “storage” means preservation of avocado under controlled conditions to preserve its quality.

PART II AVOCADO VARIETIES

Recognized
avocado
variety
Cap. 308

3. These Regulations shall apply to avocado variety cultivated by a farmer and registered in accordance with the Seeds Act or any other applicable law.

Seedling
certification

4.-(1) A producer of avocado seedlings shall be registered and certified under the Seeds Act.

- Cap.308 (2) A farmer shall ensure that the seedling is certified by the relevant authority and assigned certification number before being released from the nursery.
- (3) An avocado seedling producer shall maintain records of nursery operations, including-
- (a) source of seed and provenance of scion used;
 - (b) variety of seeds and scion used;
 - (c) certification details of seeds used;
 - (d) number of seedlings propagated annually; and
 - (e) a list of farmers to whom seedlings were sold.
- Cap. 308 (4) A farmer shall purchase avocado seedlings from a producer registered and certified under the Seeds Act.
- (5) A farmer shall maintain records of seedling sources for inspection by the Authority.
- (6) Records of seedling sources shall include the avocado variety, source nursery, date of purchase and certification number.

PART III ESTABLISHMENT AND MANAGEMENT OF ORCHARD

- Planting of
avocado
seedling 5.-(1) Avocado seedling shall be planted at a spacing that ensures sunlight penetration, air circulation and facilitates orchard management practices.
- (2) A farmer shall-
- (a) plant healthy seedlings produced from certified commercial nurseries;
 - (b) select seedlings with active root system;
 - (c) treat seedlings with appropriate registered pesticide before transplanting;
 - (d) plant nursery trees promptly after their arrival;
 - (e) cover soil surface with 5 centimetre-thick mulch and around the young tree.
- (3) The planting system for avocado orchard shall be determined by topographical characteristics of the farm and shall include-
- (a) a square planting system which involves establishment of seedlings in straight and parallel rows with uniform inter plant and inter-

row spacing for farms with slope between 0 and 5 percent;

- (b) a hexagonal planting system in which seedlings are uniformly established to form equilateral triangular arrangements allowing for an increase of more than 15 percent in plant population per unit area compared to the square planting system, which shall be applicable for farms with slopes between 5 and 15 percent; and
- (c) the establishment of seedlings along contour lines applied on farms with land slopes ranging from 15 to 45 percent and which may be implemented in combination with other orchard planting arrangements, provided that contour lines are strictly observed.

(4) Plant spacing shall depend on growth characteristics of individual variety, soil type, soil fertility status, agro-ecological conditions and agronomical practices.

Orchard
management
and
maintenance

6. A farmer shall ensure that-

- (a) an avocado orchard is properly maintained including conducting effective field sanitation;
- (b) each avocado tree is provided with a clean and weed-free basin around its base at all times;
- (c) an avocado seedling is supplied with fertilisers in accordance with soil nutrient requirements and the respective stage of crop growth;
- (d) fertiliser application, including rate and schedule is done as prescribed by extension officer; and
- (e) the use of chemical agents for weed control in the orchard complies with guidance or recommendations of an extension officer.

Intercropping

7.-(1) A farmer may grow additional crops on an avocado farm in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

(2) Avocados may be intercropped with leguminous and other crops upon the recommendation of an extension officer.

Irrigation

8.-(1) A farmer shall be required to adhere to effective irrigation methods that provide consistent and optimal soil moisture for healthy tree growth, flowering, fruit set and fruit development, while preventing waterlogging and conditions that may lead to root diseases.

(2) Irrigation scheduling shall consider tree age, soil type, climatic conditions and critical growth stages.

Soil nutrient
management

9.-(1) Soil analysis shall be conducted by a qualified specialist or at a laboratory that is duly recognized and accredited to provide such services.

(2) A farmer shall implement soil nutrient management plan based on the soil testing and nutrient requirements of the crops.

(3) A farmer shall conduct soil testing at least once in every three years in accordance with the procedures prescribed by the Ministry or the Authority.

(4) A farmer shall apply soil nutrients in accordance with the results of soil analysis and applicable market requirements.

Pruning

10.-(1) A farmer shall prune avocado trees to maintain proper tree structure, remove dead or diseased branches and allow enough sunlight penetration.

(2) Pruning tools shall be kept clean and sharp to avoid injuring trees or spreading diseases.

(3) Pruning shall be carried out as follows:

(a) reformative pruning shall be undertaken during the first to third year after planting for the purpose of developing optimal tree canopy structure, and all weak, damaged or poorly positioned branches shall be removed to establish a strong trunk and well-balanced canopy;

(b) maintenance pruning shall be undertaken annually on bearing trees to control tree size, to

allow for the development of new productive shoots and to remove dead, diseased or broken branches; and

- (c) rejuvenation pruning shall be undertaken on old or poorly productive trees in order to restore their productive capacity and major branches shall be cut back.

Service
provider

11-(1) A service provider shall possess the necessary skills and be approved by the Authority.

(2) A service provider shall be responsible for-

- (a) advising on the best practices for pest and disease management;
(b) providing pruning techniques;
(c) training farmers on farm cleaning, pest identification, disease symptoms and recommending prompt control measures; and
(d) submitting reports to the Authority and other relevant authorities as required regarding the services rendered.

(3) Reports submitted under subregulation (2) shall include-

- (a) statistics on planting;
(b) data on harvests;
(c) information on pests and diseases; and
(d) seasonal yield projections.

Pest
management

12.-(1) A farmer shall ensure that his farm is maintained in a clean condition and free from weeds.

(2) A farmer shall employ appropriate methods, based on advice from an extension officer, to control, prevent, treat and protect avocados against crops diseases and pest infestations.

(3) Information on outbreaks of avocado diseases shall be reported to an extension officer for timely intervention and mitigation.

PART IV AVOCADO SPECIFICATIONS, QUALITY AND GRADING

Grading during
harvest

13.-(1) Avocados shall be graded during harvest at the maturity level according to their intended use,

(2) Avocados shall be graded on accordance with the criteria set out in the First Schedule.

Maturity
indicator

14.-(1) Maturity shall be measured based on the dry matter content according to the avocado variety.

(2) Subject to the provisions of subregulation (1), avocados shall be required to meet a minimum dry matter content of not less than twenty-one percent.

Export or
import permit

15.-(1) An exporter or importer of avocados shall, before exportation or importation, apply to the Authority by filling Form No.1 as set out in the Second Schedule and be issued with an export or import permit.

(2) The export or import permit issued by the Authority shall be in Form No. 2 or Form No. 3 as set out in the Second Schedule.

Quality of
avocado for
exportation

16. An exporter of avocados shall ensure that the avocados meet the requirements of these Regulations, quality and phytosanitary standards of the importing country.

Quality of
imported
avocado

17. An importer of avocados, shall comply with the quality and grading standards specified under these Regulations.

PART V

HARVESTING AND PURCHASING OF AVOCADOS

Registration of
avocado
harvester

18. A person who intends to be registered as an avocado harvester shall apply for a certificate to the Authority by using form No. 4 as set out in the Second Schedule.

Conditions for
harvesting

19.-(1) The avocado harvester shall be required to-
(a) use service providers approved by the Authority; and

(b) apply good harvesting practices when picking avocados and leave a short peduncle in order to prevent fruit from decay.

(2) A person shall not throw, drop or mishandle avocados during harvesting.

Training for
harvesters

20.-(1) A person engaged in the harvesting of avocados shall be required to undergo training on the-

- (a) proper harvesting techniques;
- (b) identification of mature avocados;
- (c) use of appropriate tools;
- (d) identification of signs of pests or diseases;
- (e) observance of proper hygiene practices to prevent contamination of the fruit; and
- (f) applicable harvesting requirements.

(2) The Authority shall provide training to an avocado harvester and issue a certificate in Form No. 5 prescribed in the Second Schedule.

(3) After completion of the initial training, a service provider shall be required to undergo refresher training every three years.

Post-harvest
handling

21.-(1) A farmer shall ensure that the harvested avocados are removed from the farm and transported to a designated collection area within six hours of harvesting and shall be transported from the collection area to the packing facility within ten hours.

(2) An owner of avocados shall ensure that the avocados are, at all times during transportation, protected from direct sunlight, rain or wind.

(3) The supervisor of avocado collection areas shall ensure that the areas are clean, shaded, and ventilated.

(4) An owner of avocados shall ensure that the avocados are handled in a manner that avoids bruising or any other physical damage during loading and unloading.

Purchasing of
avocados

22.-(1) A person who intends to purchase avocado for commercial purpose shall apply for a permit to the

Authority by filling Form No.6 as set out in the Second Schedule.

(2) An avocado purchasing permit issued by the Authority shall be in Form No. 7 as set out in the Second Schedule.

(3) An applicant under subregulation (1), shall be required to-

- (a) purchase from areas approved by the Authority for harvest;
- (b) employ harvesters approved by the Authority;
- (c) purchase in accordance with the minimum grade-based pricing;
- (d) submit to the Authority the details of an agent, if any, used in purchasing avocados; and
- (e) in the case of a foreign purchaser, open a foreign currency account in Tanzania banks.

(4) Without prejudice to the provisions of any other law, a foreign purchaser shall be required to purchase avocados at a collection center, a packing center or through an agent registered with the Authority.

Avocado
purchasing
agent

23.-(1) A person who intends to be registered as an avocado purchasing agent shall apply for a certificate to the Authority by filling Form No.8 as set out in the Second Schedule.

(2) The certificate issued to a purchasing agent by the Authority shall be in Form No. 9 as set out in the Second Schedule.

Grounds for
suspension or
revocation of
agency
certificate

24. The Authority may revoke or suspend an agency certificate where it is satisfied that-

- (a) the certificate was obtained by fraud or misrepresentation;
- (b) the agent has contravened the terms and conditions of the certificate;
- (c) the certificate has been transferred to another person; or
- (d) the agent has contravened the provisions of the Act or these Regulations.

PART VI
COLLECTION AND PACK HOUSE FACILITIES

| Collection facility | 25. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, avocados shall be purchased at a collection facility. |
| Registration of pack house | 26. An owner or operator of an avocado pack house shall not operate such pack house unless he is registered by the Authority in accordance with the Regulations made under the Act. |
| Activities at pack house | 27. -(1) The pack house shall be used for-
(a) grading of avocados in accordance with conditions prescribed in the First Schedule;
(b) cleaning of avocados;
(c) sorting and packing of avocados using appropriate packing materials in accordance to market requirements;
(d) preparing avocados for the intended market; and
(e) making any other necessary preparations to ensure that avocados meet the acceptable quality and safety standards for the intended market.
(2) A person shall not carry out any activity which is dangerous or harmful to the quality or standards of avocados in the pack house. |
| Hygiene and safety of pack house | 28. -(1) An owner or operator of a pack house facility shall comply with hygiene and safety requirements to prevent contamination of avocados.
(2) Hygiene and safety measures at a packing facility shall include-
(a) regular cleaning of water storage facilities, grading tables, and infrastructure;
(b) proper disposal of waste;
(c) control of pests and vermin;
(d) provision of hand washing facilities; and
(e) implementation of a hygiene training programme for all staff. |

(3) An owner or operator of a pack house facility shall ensure the implementation of a hygiene programme which shall be reviewed and updated periodically.

Traceability
system and
record keeping

29.-(1) There shall be a system for traceability of quality and safety throughout the avocado value chain to ensure the conditions prescribed under these Regulations are complied with.

(2) The traceability system shall include-

- (a) unique identification numbers for each grade of avocados;
- (b) records of the date, time, and place of harvesting;
- (c) information on the farmer and the avocado variety;
- (d) records of processing and storage;
- (e) details of the purchaser or exporter; and
- (f) a system of linking avocados to customers or sellers.

(3) The following records shall be prepared, kept and submitted, when required, to the Authority-

(a) in the case of a farmer-

- (i) pesticides used;
- (ii) the date of harvest and quantity of avocados harvested;
- (iii) proof of sale;
- (iv) purchaser information; and
- (v) the farm from which the avocados were harvested.

(b) in the case of a purchaser-

- (i) quantities of avocados purchased;
- (ii) details of the farm owner from which the avocados were harvested;
- (iii) details of the harvester;
- (iv) the pack house facility; and
- (v) proof of sale.

(c) in the case of an owner or operator of a pack house-

- (i) quantities of avocados received;

- (ii) details of a transporter who delivered the consignment;
- (iii) details of the purchaser to whom the consignment was delivered;
- (iv) dates of receipt and dispatch of avocado; and
- (v) details of the transporter who collected the consignment from the pack house.

PART VII PACKAGING AND LABELLING

Packaging
materials

30.-(1) Avocados shall be packed in appropriate packaging materials.

(2) The avocado harvester shall ensure that avocados are packaged in a manner that protects them from mechanical damage, contamination, moisture loss and deterioration during handling, storage and transportation.

(3) Packaging materials shall be clean, dry, strong and adequately ventilated.

(4) Each package shall contain avocados of the same variety, maturity stage and quality grade to ensure uniformity.

Labelling

31. Avocado packages shall bear labels that are clearly visible and easily legible in Kiswahili, English, or such other language as may be required, and shall contain essential information in accordance with the avocado grade, including-

- (a) name and address of the producer or packer;
- (b) avocado variety;
- (c) grade of avocados;
- (d) net weight or number of avocados;
- (e) date of packaging;
- (f) country of origin;
- (g) storage conditions; and
- (h) any other information as the Authority, a customer, or any other government institution may require.

Misleading
labels

32.-(1) Labels shall not contain false or misleading information regarding to the quality, origin, weight, size, quantity, or characteristics of avocados.

(2) The use of terms such as “organic” or “chemical-free” shall be permitted only where the avocados have been so certified by the relevant competent authority.

PART VIII

STORAGE AND TRANSPORT

Temperature
control

33.-(1) Avocados shall be stored or transported at a temperature that maintains quality and prevents chilling injury or premature ripening.

(2) The optimal temperature for storage or transportation of avocados shall vary according to the variety and stage of maturity and shall range from 5 to 7 degrees Celsius.

(3) Temperature monitoring devices shall be used to record temperature data during transportation.

Avocado
storage facility

34.-(1) An avocado storage facility shall be clean and equipped with temperature control systems.

(2) The Authority shall conduct inspections at avocado storage facilities to verify their suitability.

Cold chain

35.-(1) For the purposes of these Regulations, the cold chain shall include-

- (a) storage of avocados in storage facilities; and
- (b) transportation of avocados in refrigerated vehicles.

(2) Every person involved in the storage or transportation of avocados shall be responsible for maintaining the cold chain.

PART IX

AVOCADO MARKET

Opening of
season

36.-(1) The Authority shall, after satisfying itself as to the maturity of avocados, issue a public notice declaring the opening of the harvesting season in the respective area.

(2) The commencement of the season shall include-

- (a) the commencement of avocado harvesting;
- (b) the announcement of areas in which avocado harvesting shall begin; and
- (c) the announcement of the minimum price for avocados for the season, taking into account prevailing market conditions.

(3) A farmer shall not harvest avocados unless the Authority has declared the commencement of the season.

Market
information

37. The Authority shall, in collaboration with relevant authorities, provide information on the status of the avocado market at national and international levels, which shall include-

- (a) quantities of avocados available on the market;
- (b) levels of market demand; and
- (c) marketing conditions, including types of avocados and average prices.

PART X

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Annual meeting

38. The Authority shall ensure the organization and coordination of an annual meeting of avocado stakeholders for the purpose of reviewing various matters, including the establishment of mechanisms for regulating the avocado trade.

Training

39. Any person may attend professional training programmes on avocado production as may be organized and coordinated by the Authority.

Phytosanitary
requirements
Cap. 133

40. An exporter of avocados shall comply with the provisions of the Plant Health Act regarding preservation of the quality of avocados, and phytosanitary requirements.

Determination,
grant or refusal
of application

41.-(1) The Authority shall, within fourteen days from the date of receipt of an application under these Regulations, determine the application.

(2) Where the Authority is satisfied that the application complies with the prescribed criteria and conditions it shall issue a registration number, permit or licence, as the case may be, to the applicant.

(3) Where the Authority considers that the application does not comply with the prescribed criteria and conditions, it shall refuse to grant such application and communicate the decision to the applicant stating reasons for the refusal within seven days from the date of its delivery.

Prohibition of
harvesting
avocados

42. The Authority may, in addition to any penalty provided under these Regulations, where it is satisfied that avocado crops do not meet quality standards, prohibit the farmer from harvesting avocado for commercial purposes as it may be determined by the Authority.

Cancellation or
suspension of
licence, permit
or certificate

43.-(1) The Authority may, where it is satisfied that the holder of a licence, permit or certificate issued under these Regulations has breached the conditions under which the licence, permit or certificate was issued or has contravened the provisions of these Regulations, revoke the licence, permit or certificate, as the case may be.

(2) The Authority shall, within fourteen days from the date of intention of revocation or suspension, issue a notice requiring the person under subregulation (1) to submit, in writing, reasons as to why the Authority should not revoke or suspend his licence, permit or certificate.

(3) The Authority shall, upon expiration of the time specified under subregulation (2) or where the holder of a licence, permit or certificate fails to adduce sufficient reasons, revoke the licence, permit or certificate as the case may be.

(4) A holder of a cancelled licence or permit shall immediately after cancellation surrender it to the Authority.

Appeals

44.-(1) A person aggrieved by a decision of the Authority relating to the cancellation or suspension of a licence under these Regulations may, within sixty days from the date of the decision, appeal to the Minister in writing, stating the grounds of appeal, attaching a copy of the decision, and serving a copy thereof on the Authority.

(2) The Authority shall, upon receipt of a copy of the appeal, submit to the Minister within seven days such explanatory statements as may be required, and shall serve a copy thereof to the appellant.

(3) The Minister shall determine the appeal within thirty days from the date of receipt of the Authority's explanatory information.

Offences and penalties

45. A person who contravenes the provisions of these Regulations commits an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty as provided under the Act.
